About CIDAR Uganda

The Community Initiatives for Development and Action Research (CIDAR Uganda) is a Community Based Organization (CBO) based in Eastern Uganda that works to contribute to poverty reduction and sustainable development of the disadvantaged and vulnerable communities through community-led programs and interventions in Uganda. Since 2008, CIDAR Uganda has been partnering with Wheel4life Foundation to provide bikes to the neediest populations (such as school children, youths, poor households and vulnerable public servants) who needed bikes as a means of transport.

To date, over 1,500 beneficiaries, mostly students and vulnerable populations in critical need of basic transport means have so far benefited from the partnership.

Wheels4Life and CIDAR Uganda believe that a bike can significantly change the life of an individual, a household, a community or society.

Riding Out of Deprivation in Uganda:

In late 2022, CIDAR Uganda in collaboration with Wheels4Life Foundation started an initiative dubbed "**Riding Out of Deprivation in Uganda**" whose objective is to support poor and vulnerable people to escape deprivation and chronic poverty through access to bike transport services.

The *"Riding Out of Deprivation"* initiative was based on the motivation that a bike can greatly transform the lives of neediest individuals to escape deprivation and chronic poverty.

The Riding Out of Deprivation Initiative was preceded by the "*Riding Away from Covid-19*" Initiative, through which W4L extended support to CIDAR Uganda aimed at complementing government efforts in the fight against the Covid-19 pandemic in Uganda. Accordingly, a total of 233 bikes were distributed to health workers in Jinja and Iganga districts to facilitate their movement to and from health facilities to provide the much-needed response against the Covid-19 pandemic in the region (see photo below). The results of the initiative have since significantly enhanced the capacity of the local health facilities to management the Covid-19 and other pandemics.

In November 2022, Wheels4Life extended additional support to CIDAR Uganda (worth 19 million Uganda shillings) to kick-start the "**Riding Out of Deprivation**" initiative through provision of bikes to the neediest beneficiaries in Eastern Uganda.

Purchase of the Bikes

On 12th November 2022, after successful negotiations with the bike supplier (Jupiter Impex Limited), **CIDAR Uganda purchased a total of 57 units of fully fitted bikes** costing Eighteen million two hundred sixty-eight five hundred Uganda shillings (18,268,500 Ugx) **equivalent to USD 4,640 USD**. Each bike was purchased at 320,500 Uganda shillings (about USD 84.3) which was a very competitive market rate. In addition, three (3) complementary bikes were given to CIDAR Uganda by the bike supplier as additional support. The supplier promised to provide 5 more complimentary bikes plus a discounted per unit cost if we made another significant bike purchase in the next four months (December 2022 to March 2023).

A total of USD 170 was expended on transportation of bikes to the distribution venue. The balance of USD 190 was left on the account and will be used to cater for bank charges and future bike transactions.

Bike Distribution:

On Thursday, 17th November 2022, CIDAR Uganda in collaboration with Agrichi, a local Community Based Organization (CBO), distributed the bikes to the neediest beneficiaries as follows: Agrichi, is championing awareness and advocacy initiatives against sickle cell anaemia in Eastern Uganda.

- Majority of the bikes (34 bikes) were donated to health workers (female and male) who walk very long distances to provide the much-needed health care services in hard-toreach communities.
- ii. A total of twenty-three (23) bikes were donated to schoolgoing children with severe transport needs. All these beneficiaries travel for very long distances to access school.
- iii. Three (3) bikes were distributed as community bikes to village administrators in neighbouring villages. These community bikes will help all those households or individuals in critical

need of transport means for life-saving, social and economic purposes.

How the Beneficiaries will use the bikes

During this Phase, the bikes were distributed mainly to serve the following purposes:

a) Provision of health care services:

Most of the bikes (34 bikes) donated health were to workers who were vulnerable critical in need of and transport I† is means. expected that the beneficiaries will use to bikes to get to the health facilities earlier than before and provide the much-needed health services on time and also extend their working



hours since they have ready transport means. Using the bikes, they will also access very distant locations to provided life-saving health care.

b) Transport means to school:

Twenty-three bikes were donated to vulnerable school-going children. All the benefiting children traverse very long distances to access schools. It is expected that the bikes will help increase the class attendance time for the beneficiaries since they will now arrive early at school and leave late. They also promised to use the bikes for household chores such as fetching clean water for domestic consumption and attending social events and functions.



c) Community bikes:

The concept of a community bikes was first introduced by W4L about a decade ago. Three bikes were donated to local administrators to serve as community bikes. All community members in need of very cheap transport means to access health services, distant administration units/offices, distant markets, distant social functions or events will hire the bikes at a very small fee which will be managed as a maintenance fee.

The difference the bikes will make



As a medical staff of St. John Paul Memorial Clinic, I have been walking for 2 and a half kilometres to and from the health centre to provide health care services and this has affected my effectiveness. With this bike, I will reduce on my travel time to the facility and hence provide health care services

for more hours every day. – Ms. Rebecca Igunda (Medical Assistant, St. John Paul Memorial Clinic)

The health practitioners who received bikes confirmed that the bikes would enable them access health units in time through reduction of time taken to arrive at the health units. In effect, they would provide the much-needed health care services to many patients than before and thus save more lives in the communities where they serve. Indeed, the bikes will be a game-changer in health service provision in the local communities.



"...I will now spend less time to get to school and also leave school late which will enable me concentrate on my education more than

before. I want to become a doctor and I am very sure I will make it with this bike'' – Ms. Brenda Mateeka (Iganga High School)

"...I was born in a very poor family in our village but with the grace of God my uncle has been paying my school fees to enable me access education. *My biggest problem has been walking for about 4 kilometres to and from school every day.* This bike is a great relief to me and to my family. Thank you W4L. – Ms. Agnes Nakadama (Senior Two Student)





"Every day, I wake up at 5am and walk for 2 hours to get to my school where I work and 2 hours back home. With this bike, my dream is to help as many students as possible to pass their A-Level exams and join prestigious Universities in USA. – **Ms. Florence Nabulooli, Teacher, Kodet Secondary School.**

My name is Mark Okoboi, a student at Kodet Secondary

School. I have been suffering to walk very long distances to my school. With this bike, my future is brighter than before. I will be the first student at school every day.



In an interview with **Ms. Pamela Nabukenya**, a Local Administration leader at Kimanya Administration Unit, she appreciated Wheels4Life and CIDAR Uganda for the donation of the community bike to her community and in her own words I quote:

"Ekyizibu ekyisinga ku kyalo kyaffe kyikwatagana ne'ebuula lya ebyentambula."

Amagali gano gagenda tuyamba nyo mu kulondoola ebitundu byaffe okutangila obumenyi bwamateeka. Nabo abetaaga entabula bagya kwewolanga egali ziino basikozese ku miwendo emitono ddala"

translated as:

"The biggest problem in our village here is the lack of cheap basic transport means. These bikes will help us so much in maintaining security in our village and fighting crime."

"...They will also help our people who need basic transport means for cultural and socio-economic purposes to use the community bikes at a small fee". "We thank Wheels4Life and CIDAR Uganda for this donation".

Looking Ahead:

While the "**Riding Out of Deprivation**" initiative is a new concept, the prospects point to an impactful future. The 60 bikes courtesy of Wheels4Life and Jupiter Impex Ltd (the bike supplier) that were distributed in Phase 1 will create significant impact in the lives and livelihoods of the poor beneficiaries. However, the demand for bikes as the commonest and most basic means of transport continues to grow in these areas.

About 2,000 people (poor boys, girls, youths, men and women) are in dire need for transport means to solve different challenges such as: access to education, access to distant water sources, access to markets, access to health care services and for recreational purposes.

Therefore, it is our sincere hope

that Wheels4Life Foundation shall continue to partner with CIADR Uganda to ensure that the together we contribute to the transformation of neediest individuals.
